- (c) Each year, the Department of Education must award one-half of the early childhood education scholarship money to parents and legal guardians who reside in the seven-county metropolitan area and the other half to parents and legal guardians who live in greater Minnesota. If any money remains from either half after the initial applications, the commissioner may use that money to make early education scholarships in the other region. If this appropriation is insufficient to provide early childhood education scholarships to all eligible children, the Department of Education shall make scholarships available on a first-come, first-served basis within each of the two geographic regions of the state.
- (d) The commissioner of education shall submit a written report to the education committees of the legislature by January 15, 2012, describing its plan for implementation of scholarships under this subdivision for the 2012-2013 school year.
 - (e) Any balance in the first year does not cancel but is available in the second year.
