9.25 To provide the money appropriated in this act from the bond proceeds fund, the

9.26 <u>commissioner of management and budget shall sell and issue bonds of the state in an</u>

9.27 amount up to \$278,722,000 in the manner, upon the terms, and with the effect prescribed

9.28 by Minnesota Statutes, sections 16A.631 to 16A.675, and by the Minnesota Constitution,

9.29 article XI, sections 4 to 7.

9.30 Sec. 4. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE.</u>

9.31 This act is effective the day following final enactment.
