BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT APPROPRIATIONS.

The sums shown in the column under "APPROPRIATIONS" are appropriated from

the bond proceeds fund, or another named fund, to the state agencies or officials indicated,

to be spent for public purposes. Appropriations of bond proceeds must be spent as

authorized by the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, section 5, paragraph (a), to acquire

1.12

and better public land and buildings and other public improvements of a capital nature, or

1.13

as authorized by the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, section 5, paragraphs (b) to (j), or

article XIV. Unless otherwise specified, the appropriations in this act are available until

 8.23 of the principal amount of state bonds sold to
 8.24 finance projects authorized by this section.

8.25 After each sale of general obligation bonds,
 8.26 the commissioner of management and budget
 8.27 shall notify the board of the amounts assessed
 8.28 for each year for the life of the bonds.

8.29 (b) The board need not pay debt service
 8.30 on bonds sold to finance higher education
 8.31 asset preservation and replacement. Where a
 8.32 nonstate match is required, the debt service is
 8.33 due on a principal amount equal to one-third
 8.34 of the total project cost, less the match
 8.35 committed before the bonds are sold.

9.1 (c) The commissioner of management and
9.2 budget shall reduce the board's assessment
9.3 each year by one-third of the net income
9.4 from investment of general obligation bond
9.5 proceeds in proportion to the amount of
9.6 principal and interest otherwise required to
9.7 be paid by the board. The board shall pay its
9.8 resulting net assessment to the commissioner
9.9 of management and budget by December
9.10 1 each year. If the board fails to make
9.11 a payment when due, the commissioner
9.12 of management and budget shall reduce
9.13 allotments for appropriations from the
9.14 general fund otherwise available to the board
9.15 and apply the amount of the reduction to
9.16 cover the missed debt service payment. The
9.17 commissioner of management and budget
9.18 shall credit the payments received from the
9.19 board to the bond debt service account in
9.20 the state bond fund each December 1 before
9.21 money is transferred from the general fund
9.22 under Minnesota Statutes, section 16A.641,
9.23 subdivision 10.

9.24 Sec. 3. **BOND SALE AUTHORIZATION.**

9.25 To provide the money appropriated in this act from the bond proceeds fund, the
9.26 commissioner of management and budget shall sell and issue bonds of the state in an
9.27 amount up to \$278,722,000 in the manner, upon the terms, and with the effect prescribed
9.28 by Minnesota Statutes, sections 16A.631 to 16A.675, and by the Minnesota Constitution,
9.29 article XI, sections 4 to 7.

9.30 Sec. 4. **EFFECTIVE DATE.**

9.31 This act is effective the day following final enactment.
