1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. DEVELOPMENTAL EDUCATION REFORM.
1.6	(a) The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities shall create
1.7	a plan to reform developmental education offerings on system campuses. The plan must
1.8	include, but is not limited to:
1.9	(1) a systemwide multiple measures placement plan to guide campuses in placement of
1.10	students into developmental education courses;
1.11	(2) uniform cut scores for student placement, where appropriate, which will lead to fewer
1.12	students being placed into developmental education courses;
1.13	(3) other identified system policy changes that will decrease the number of students
1.14	being placed into developmental education courses;
1.15	(4) accelerated pathways in mathematics, reading, and composition to ensure students
1.16	can complete developmental education work in no more than one year;
1.17	(5) a comprehensive examination of the cost structure of developmental education,
1.18	including potential financial incentives for students or other mechanisms to lower the cost
1.19	of developmental offerings for students; and
1.20	(6) identified best practices that may be used on every system campus around
1.21	developmental education offerings.
