1.9	partnerships located throughout the state, not to exceed \$100,000 per local partnership grant.
1.10	The commissioner may use a portion of this amount for administration of the grant program.
1.11	(b) A local partnership awarded a grant under this section must use the grant award for
1.12	any of the following implementation and coordination activities:
