BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. ACCELERATED CONSERVATION PLANTING PROGRAM;

APPROPRIATION.

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\$8,000,000 in fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the Board of Water and Soil Resources for an accelerated conservation planting program. This is a onetime appropriation and is available until June 30, 2026. The work must be carried out consistent with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, section 103C.501, and be used for financial and technical assistance to landowners via local units of government for the purpose of establishing or enhancing tree, shrub, and associated conservation practices that will reduce greenhouse gas emissions and add resiliency to the landscape by sequestering carbon, conserving energy, and improving water quality and habitat. Of this amount, \$500,000 must be used to address invasive species control via cooperative weed management agreements. Money appropriated in this section may only be used to acquire and plant trees native to Minnesota.

Sec. 2. LIVING SNOW FENCE PROGRAM; APPROPRIATION.

\$4,000,000 in fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of transportation for contracts to build and improve living snow fences consisting of trees, shrubs, native grasses, and wildflowers. Money appropriated in this section may only be

2.22	on school grounds while providing hands-on learning opportunities for students. A grant
2.23	application under this section must be prepared jointly with the parent-teacher organization
