1.6	Subdivision 1. Department of Education. The sum indicated in this section is

1.9	Subd. 2. Girl Scouts. (a) For a grant to Girl Scouts River Valleys as fiscal agent for Girl
1.10	Scouts councils' community engagement programs:

1.12	(b) Grant funds must be used for community engagement programs for underserved
1.13	communities and girls facing systemic barriers in education through innovative, culturally
1.14	responsive programming for underrepresented, underresourced girls in kindergarten through
1.15	grade 12, including programming relating to healthy relationships; science, technology,
1.16	engineering, and math; financial literacy; college and career readiness; and leadership

1.18	(c) By February 1, 2026, the grantee must submit a report detailing expenditures and
1.19	outcomes of the grant-supported programs to the commissioner of education and the chairs
1.20	and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with primary jurisdiction over
1.21	kindergarten through grade 12 education policy and finance. The report must include:
