326B.096 REINSTATEMENT OF LICENSES.

2.23 Subdivision 1. **Reinstatement after revocation.** (a) If a license is revoked under 2.24 this chapter and if an applicant for a license needs to pass an examination administered by 2.25 the commissioner before becoming licensed, then, in order to have the license reinstated, 2.26 the person who holds the revoked license must:

(1) retake the examination and achieve a passing score; and

- (2) meet all other requirements for an initial license, including payment of the
 application and examination fee and the license fee. The person holding the revoked
 license is not eligible for Minnesota licensure without examination based on reciprocity.
- (b) If a license is revoked under a chapter other than this chapter, then, in order tohave the license reinstated, the person who holds the revoked license must:
- 2.33 (1) apply for reinstatement to the commissioner no later than two years after the2.34 effective date of the revocation;

3.18	the license reinstated, the person who holds the terminated license must:
3.19	(1) apply for reinstatement to the commissioner no later than the date that the license
3.20	would have expired if it had not been terminated;
