BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

- Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 169.13, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
- 1.7 Subd. 2. **Careless driving.** (a) Any person who operates or halts any vehicle upon any street or highway carelessly or heedlessly in disregard of the rights of others, or in a manner that endangers or is likely to endanger any property or any person, including the driver or passengers of the vehicle, is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- (b) Unless otherwise provided by law, any person who operates or halts any vehicle
 upon any street or highway in violation of this chapter and causes great bodily harm or death
 to another is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 1.14 (c) A person charged with or cited for a violation of paragraph (b) who is not arrested,
 1.15 taken into custody, and detained until the person's first court appearance must be issued a
 1.16 summons for a court appearance. Notwithstanding section 609.101, subdivision 4, the
 1.17 Judicial Council may not include a violation of paragraph (b) on the Statewide Payables
 1.18 List.
