1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 171.02, is amended by adding a
1.7	subdivision to read:
1.8	Subd. 4a. Nondomiciled commercial driver's license. (a) The commissioner may
1.9	issue a nondomiciled commercial learner's permit or nondomiciled commercial driver's
1.10	license as provided under Code of Federal Regulations, title 49, sections 383.23(b)(1) and
1.11	383.73, or successor requirements, to a person who:
1.12	(1) is domiciled in a foreign jurisdiction; and
1.13	(2) otherwise meets the requirements to obtain a commercial permit or license
1.14	under this chapter.
1.15	(b) For purposes of this chapter, a commercial learner's permit includes a
1.16	nondomiciled commercial learner's permit, and a commercial driver's license includes a
1.17	nondomiciled commercial driver's license.
1.18	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment.
1.19	Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 171.06, subdivision 3, is amended to read:
1.20	Subd. 3. Contents of application; other information. (a) An application must:
1.21	(1) state the full name, date of birth, sex, and either (i) the residence address of the
1.22	applicant, or (ii) designated address under section 5B.05;

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(2) as may be required by the commissioner, contain a description of the applicant and any other facts pertaining to the applicant, the applicant's driving privileges, and the applicant's ability to operate a motor vehicle with safety;

- (3) state: (i) the applicant's Social Security number; or, unless:
- (ii) if (i) the applicant does not have a Social Security number and (A) is applying for a Minnesota identification card, instruction permit, or class D provisional or driver's license, that the applicant and (B) certifies that the applicant does not have a Social Security number; or
- (ii) the application is for a nondomiciled commercial driver's permit or nondomiciled commercial driver's license;
- (4) in the case of an application for an enhanced driver's license or enhanced identification card, present:
- (i) proof satisfactory to the commissioner of the applicant's full legal name, United States citizenship, identity, date of birth, Social Security number, and residence address; and
 - (ii) a photographic identity document;

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- (5) contain a space where the applicant may indicate a desire to make an anatomical gift according to paragraph (b);
- (6) contain a notification to the applicant of the availability of a living will/health care directive designation on the license under section 171.07, subdivision 7; and
- (7) contain a space where the applicant may request a veteran designation on the license under section 171.07, subdivision 15, and the driving record under section 171.12, subdivision 5a.
- (b) If the applicant does not indicate a desire to make an anatomical gift when the application is made, the applicant must be offered a donor document in accordance with section 171.07, subdivision 5. The application must contain statements sufficient to comply with the requirements of the Darlene Luther Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift Act, chapter 525A, so that execution of the application or donor document will make the anatomical gift as provided in section 171.07, subdivision 5, for those indicating a desire to make an anatomical gift. The application must be accompanied by information describing Minnesota laws regarding anatomical gifts and the need for and benefits of anatomical gifts, and the legal implications of making an anatomical gift, including the law governing revocation of anatomical gifts. The commissioner shall distribute a notice that must accompany all applications for and renewals of a driver's license or Minnesota identification card. The notice must be prepared in conjunction with a Minnesota organ procurement organization that is certified by the federal Department of Health and Human Services and must include:

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3.1	(1) a statement that provides a fair and reasonable description of the organ donation
3.2	process, the care of the donor body after death, and the importance of informing family
3.3	members of the donation decision; and
3.4	(2) a telephone number in a certified Minnesota organ procurement organization that
3.5	may be called with respect to questions regarding anatomical gifts.
3.6	(c) The application must be accompanied also by information containing relevant
3.7	facts relating to:
3.8	(1) the effect of alcohol on driving ability;
3.9	(2) the effect of mixing alcohol with drugs;
3.10	(3) the laws of Minnesota relating to operation of a motor vehicle while under the
3.11	influence of alcohol or a controlled substance; and
3.12	(4) the levels of alcohol-related fatalities and accidents in Minnesota and of arrests
3.13	for alcohol-related violations.
3.14	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment.
3.15	Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 171.07, subdivision 1b, is amended to read:
3.16	Subd. 1b. Commercial driver's license. (a) Each class C, class B, or class A
3.17	driver's license must be clearly marked "Minnesota Commercial Driver's License."
3.18	(b) Each nondomiciled commercial learner's permit and nondomiciled driver's
3.19	license must be clearly marked as required under Code of Federal Regulations, title 49,
3.20	section 383.153(c), or successor requirements.
