1.8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.9	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2012, section 245C.04, is amended to read:
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1.10	245C.04 WHEN BACKGROUND STUDY MUST OCCUR.
1.11	Subdivision 1. Licensed programs. (a) The commissioner shall conduct a
1.12	background study of an individual required to be studied under section 245C.03,
1.13	subdivision 1, at least upon application for initial license for all license types.
1.14	(b) The commissioner shall conduct a background study of an individual required
1.15	to be studied under section 245C.03, subdivision 1, at reapplication for a license for
1.16	family child care.
1.17	(c) The commissioner is not required to conduct a study of an individual at the time
1.18	of reapplication for a license if the individual's background study was completed by the
1.19	commissioner of human services for an adult foster care license holder that is also:
1.20	(1) registered under chapter 144D; or
1.21	(2) licensed to provide home and community-based services to people with
1.22	disabilities at the foster care location and the license holder does not reside in the foster
1.23	care residence; and
1.24	(3) the following conditions are met:

under section 245C.05, subdivisions 1 and 5. The background study conducted by the
commissioner of human services under this paragraph must include a review of the

(f) From January 1, 2010, to December 31, 2012, unless otherwise specified in 2.21 paragraph (c), the commissioner shall conduct a study of an individual required to 2.22 be studied under section 245C.03 at the time of reapplication for an adult foster care 2.23 or family adult day services license: (1) the county shall collect and forward to the 2.24 commissioner the information required under section 245C.05, subdivision 1, paragraphs 2.25 (a) and (b), and subdivision 5, paragraphs (a) and (b), for background studies conducted 2.26 by the commissioner for all family adult day services and for adult foster care when 2.27 the adult foster care license holder resides in the adult foster care or family adult day 2.28 services residence; (2) the license holder shall collect and forward to the commissioner 2.29 the information required under section 245C.05, subdivisions 1, paragraphs (a) and (b); 2.30 and 5, paragraphs (a) and (b), for background studies conducted by the commissioner for 2.31 adult foster care when the license holder does not reside in the adult foster care residence; 2.32 and (3) the background study conducted by the commissioner under this paragraph must 2.33 include a review of the information required under section 245C.08, subdivision 1, 2.34 paragraph (a), clauses (1) to (5), and subdivisions 3 and 4. 2.35

3.5	section 245C.05, subdivision 1, paragraphs (a) and (b), and subdivision 5, paragraphs (a)
3.6	and (b), for background studies conducted by the commissioner for all family adult day
3.7	services and for adult foster care when the adult foster care license holder resides in

4.10	(b) Organizations required to initiate background studies under sections 256B.0651

4.24	(b) Each supplemental nursing services agency must initiate background studies
4.25	using the electronic system known as NETStudy before an individual begins a position
4.26	allowing direct contact with persons served by the agency and annually thereafter.
4.27	Subd. 5. Personnel agencies; educational programs; professional services
4.28	agencies. Agencies, programs, and individuals who initiate background studies under
4.29	section 245C.03, subdivision 4, must initiate the studies annually using the electronic
4.30	system known as NETStudy.

5.20 completed on an individual required to be studied under section 245C.03, the license
5.21 holder or other entity that initiated the background study must initiate a new background
5.22 study using the electronic system known as NETStudy when an individual who is affiliated
5.23 with the license holder or other entity undergoes a legal name change.

Subdivision 1. Background studies initiated by program. A licensed program 8.1 shall document the date the program initiates a background study under this chapter 8.2 and the date the subject of the study first has direct contact with persons served by the 8.3 program in the program's personnel files. When a background study is completed under 8.4 this chapter, a licensed program shall maintain a notice that the study was undertaken and 8.5 completed in the program's personnel files. Except when background studies are initiated 8.6 through the commissioner's online system, if a licensed program has not received a 8.7 response from the commissioner under section 245C.17 within 45 days of initiation of the 88 background study request, the licensed program must contact the human services licensing 8.9 division to inquire about the status of the study. (b) If the basis for a disqualified individual's reconsideration request is that the
individual does not pose a risk of harm, the commissioner shall respond to the request
