1.7	626.8517 ELIGIBILITY FOR RECIPROCITY EXAMINATION BASED ON
1.8	RELEVANT MILITARY EXPERIENCE.
1.9	(a) For purposes of this section:
1.10	(1) "active service" has the meaning given in section 190.05, subdivision 5; and
1.11	(2) "relevant military experience" means:
1.12	(i) five years' active service experience in a military law enforcement occupational
1.13	specialty;
1.14	(ii) three years' active service experience in a military law enforcement occupational
1.15	specialty, and completion of a two-year or more degree from a regionally accredited
1.16	postsecondary education institution; or
1.17	(iii) five years' cumulative experience as a full-time peace officer in another state
1.18	combined with active service experience in a military law enforcement occupational
1.19	specialty.
1.20	(b) A person who has relevant military experience and who is eligible to take the
