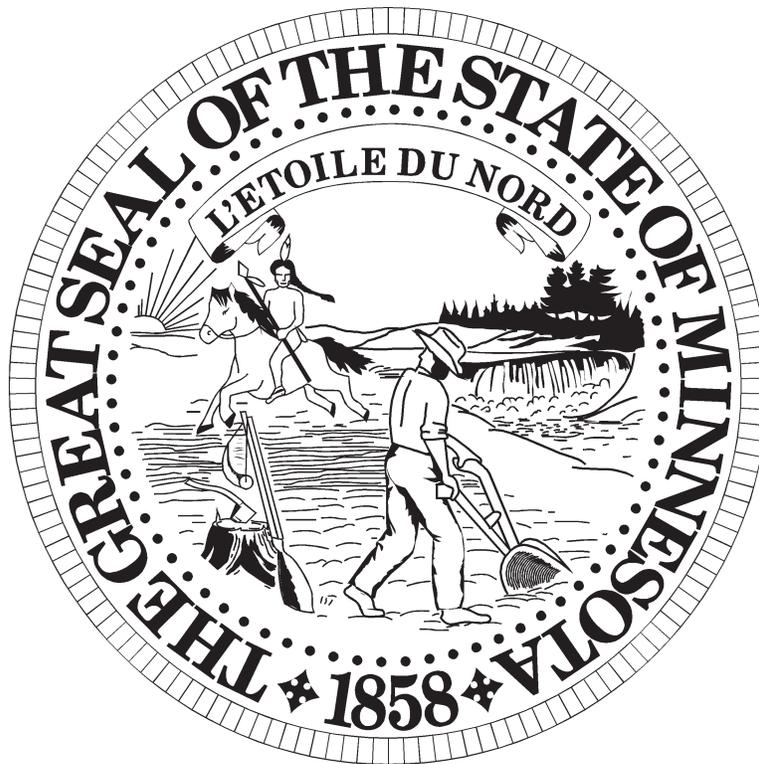

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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Executive Orders

The governor has the authority to issue written statements or orders, called Executive Orders, as well as Emergency Executive Orders. The governor's authority is specified in the *Constitution of the State of Minnesota*, Article V, and in *Minnesota Statutes* § 4.035. Emergency Executive Orders, for protection from an imminent threat to health and safety, become effective immediately, are filed with the secretary of state, and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after they are issued. Other Executive Orders become effective 15 days after publication in the *State Register* and filing with the secretary of state. Unless otherwise specified, an executive order expires 90 days after the date the governor who issued the order vacates office.

Minnesota Executive Council

Executive Order 14-02-A: Notice of Resolution - Extending a Peacetime Emergency

The Governor, **MARK DAYTON**, convened an emergency meeting of the Executive Council on Friday, January 31 to consider extending for up to 30 days the peacetime emergency declared on January 27, 2014 in the Governor's Emergency Executive Order 14-02, which provided a peacetime emergency in relation to the severe shortage of propane and other home heating fuel supplies statewide, and to activate the state emergency operations plan.

WHEREAS, persistent and repetitive extreme arctic cold weather conditions are prolonging shortages and interruptions in the availability of propane and other home heating fuels throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, the limited availability of propane and resultant increases in prices are making propane unaffordable for many Minnesotans; and

WHEREAS, an increasing number of household, farms, businesses, and other enterprises are at significant risk of running out of heating fuel, posing an immediate threat to human life and public welfare; and

WHEREAS, the resources of local, county, and state governments have been fully utilized to ensure an adequate response to protect the life and safety of persons in the affected areas, including all the counties of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, in response to the emergency conditions, the Governor on January 27, 2014, in Executive Order 14-02, declared a peacetime emergency, activated the Minnesota Emergency Operations Plan, and directed state agencies to continue to provide necessary assistance in the affected areas; and

WHEREAS, the need for the State to provide emergency relief services will continue for more than five days and it is, therefore, necessary for the Executive Council to immediately consider and approve extension of the peacetime emergency under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 12.31, subdivision 2;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, at its meeting on Friday, January 31, 2014, that the peacetime emergency declared in Executive Order 14-02 is extended for 30 days under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 12.31, subdivision 2.
