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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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Exempt Rules

Exempt rules are excluded from the normal rulemaking procedures (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.386 and 14.388). They are most often of two kinds. One kind is specifically exempted by the Legislature from rulemaking procedures, but approved for form by the Revisor of Statutes, reviewed for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings, and then published in the *State Register*. These exempt rules are effective for two years only.

The second kind of exempt rule is one adopted where an agency for good cause finds that the rulemaking provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14 are unnecessary, impracticable, or contrary to the public interest. This exemption can be used only where the rules:

- (1) address a serious and immediate threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or
- (2) comply with a court order or a requirement in federal law in a manner that does not allow for compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* Sections 14.14-14.28, or
- (3) incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required, or
- (4) make changes that do not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of the rules.

These exempt rules are also reviewed for form by the Revisor of Statutes, for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings and then published in the *State Register*. In addition, the Office of Administrative Hearings must determine whether the agency has provided adequate justification for the use of this exemption. Rules adopted under clauses (1) or (2) above are effective for two years only. The Legislature may also exempt an agency from the normal rulemaking procedures and establish other procedural and substantive requirements unique to that exemption.

REQUEST FOR COMMENTS on Possible Amendment to Rules Governing Asbestos Abatement, *Minnesota Rules*, Chapter 4620; Revisor's ID Number RD4302

Subject of Rules. The Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) requests comments on its possible amendment to rules governing asbestos abatement. The Department is considering rule amendments to update and clarify the existing regulations. MDH adopted Chapter 4620, rules that govern the abatement of asbestos-containing materials, in July of 1987. The last major revision of the asbestos abatement regulations occurred in 1996. Subsequent minor additions and corrections were in 2001 and 2008. Accordingly, the proposed

rules would bring clarification to complex or technical areas of existing rules, edit or delete rule parts that are inconsistent with other state regulations, update rule parts to address asbestos abatement activities not considered during the original 1987 rulemaking, and improve how training courses are conducted.

Persons Affected. Except as otherwise specifically provided in Chapter 4620, these proposed rules would apply to all persons who perform asbestos-related work, individuals who conduct asbestos management activities and entities that have asbestos related work or asbestos management activities performed for its benefit. These proposed rules would likely affect licensed asbestos abatement currently regulated by the state; individuals certified as asbestos workers, supervisors, inspectors, management planners, project designers; and the general public within the State of Minnesota. Chapter 4620's purpose is to protect both licensees and the general public from unwanted or unsafe exposures to asbestos fibers.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 326.78 authorizes the MDH to adopt rules that allow the state to regulate asbestos-related work, including licensing of contractors, certification of individuals, work practices involving the removal of asbestos-containing material and to ensure that individuals conducting asbestos-related work have proper training and qualifications.

Public Comment. Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these proposed rules in writing until further notice is published in the *State Register* that the MDH intends to adopt or to withdraw the proposed rules, which will be more than 60 days after this notice is published in the *State Register*. The MDH plans to appoint an advisory committee to comment on the possible rules.

MDH is particularly interested in advice on whether the cost of complying with proposed rules in the first year after the rules take effect will exceed \$25,000 for any small business or small city. [A small business is a business (either for profit or nonprofit) with fewer than 50 full-time employees and a small city is a city with fewer than ten full-time employees.] MDH also seeks advice on the cumulative effect of the rule has with regard to other federal and state regulations related to the specific purpose of the rule.
