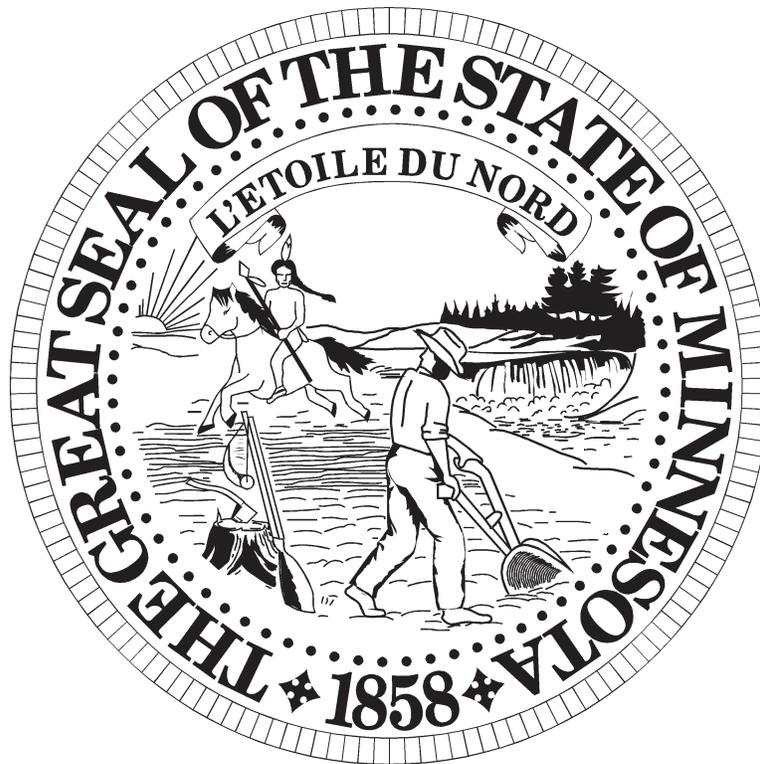

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Adopted Rules

A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule. If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed. If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 39, Number 23, pages 778-780, December 08, 2014 (39 SR 778), are adopted as proposed.

Expedited Emergency Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited emergency rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Expedited emergency rules are effective upon publication in the *State Register*, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions.

Expedited emergency rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited emergency rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Adopted Expedited Emergency Natural Resource Rules: Prohibited and Regulated Invasive Species

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the above entitled rules have been adopted through the process prescribed by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.027, subdivision 13 (b). The statutory authority for the contents of the rules is *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84D.12.

The condition that does not allow compliance with *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.0451 to 97A.0459, is that this action is part of an ongoing effort to maintain an accurate and updated list of invasive species for the state of Minnesota. We have identified two species as

being listed incorrectly. This rulemaking quickly changes the classification of water hyacinth (*Eichhornia crassipes*) as a regulated invasive species instead of prohibited, and correctly classifies *Cherax destructor* as an invertebrate. The department intends to put those changes into permanent rule status at the earliest opportunity.

Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: Special Spring Turkey Hunts

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the above entitled rules have been adopted through the process prescribed by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.027, subdivision 13 (b). The statutory authority for the contents of the rules is *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.435, 97A.465, 97A.137, 97B.111, and 97B.723.

The conditions that do not allow compliance with *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.0451 to 97A.0459, are that annual participant information needed for setting quotas and areas for special turkey hunts are not finalized by hunt organizers until late December. Changes to hunting access in the sanctuary at Carlos Avery Wildlife Management Area are being made to better accommodate increasing use by persons with disabilities while continuing to maintain the area's value as a wildlife sanctuary.

(2) taking wild turkeys during the spring wild turkey season in those portions of the sanctuaries that lie within an open spring wild turkey hunting zone.

Subp. 2. Permits for disability hunts. For the 2015 spring wild turkey season, the following permits are available for disability hunts:

A. For wild turkey permit area 507, one additional permit per time periods A to C is available for individuals with disabilities participating in a special hunt in the Sand Prairie Wildlife Management Area. Capable Partners is the sponsoring nonprofit organization.

B. For wild turkey permit area 510, four additional permits per time periods A to C are available for individuals with disabilities participating in a special hunt in the Becklin Homestead Park Wildlife Management Area. Capable Partners and the Isanti County Sportsman’s Club are the sponsoring nonprofit organizations.

C. Camp Ripley Military Reservation, within wild turkey permit area 507, is open for spring turkey hunting for individuals with disabilities participating in a special hunt. One nonhunting mentor must accompany each disabled hunter. The St. Cloud Veterans Administration is the sponsoring organization.

D. For wild turkey permit area 507, two additional permits are available for both time periods A and C for individuals with disabilities participating in a special hunt at the Prairie Woods Environmental Learning Center. Midwest Outdoors Unlimited and Prairie Woods Environmental Learning Center are the sponsoring nonprofit organizations.

E. For wild turkey permit area 505, two additional permits per time periods A to C are available for individuals with disabilities participating in a special hunt in the Minnesota Valley National Wildlife Refuge. Capable Partners is the sponsoring nonprofit organization.

F. For wild turkey permit area 507, four additional permits per time periods A to C are available for individuals with disabilities participating in a special hunt. Midwest Outdoors Unlimited is the sponsoring nonprofit organization.

G. For wild turkey permit area 508, two additional permits per time periods A and C are available for individuals with disabilities participating in a special hunt in the Benton County Bend in the River Park. Midwest Outdoors Unlimited is the sponsoring nonprofit organization.

Procedural Background

Spring Lake is 642 acre lake located in the southern part of the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area in the City of Prior Lake and Spring Lake Township. The MPCA included this lake on the 303(d) impaired waters list for Minnesota in 2002 due to excess nutrient (phosphorus) concentrations. Elevated phosphorus levels lead to excess algae abundance and thereby adversely impacts aquatic recreation. As the basis for restoring this waterbody the MPCA staff completed a Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) study for Spring Lake which was approved by U.S Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in September of 2011. That TMDL was based on the existing water quality standard for phosphorus, 40 micrograms/liter (ig/L). The Prior Lake-Spring Lake Watershed District has since done a technical study that has established that a site-specific standard of 60 ig/L would be more appropriate for this lake. Should this site-specific standard be approved by EPA the TMDL will need to be revised. This revision will affect the allowable pollutant load allocations which will ultimately mean less stringent load reductions will be needed for Spring Lake.

Site-Specific Standard Background

Minnesota Rules, ch 7050 provides water quality standards for waterbodies as well as the legal basis for consideration and adoption of site-specific water quality standards (<https://www.revisor.leg.state.mn.us/rules/?id=7050.0222>). Per this rule, lakes are assigned eutrophication standards for three parameters: total phosphorus, chlorophyll-a (the main pigment in algae) and Secchi disk depth (a measure of water clarity). The MPCA proposes changing the total phosphorus target for Spring Lake from 40 ìg/L to 60 ìg/L and the chlorophyll-a target from 14 ìg/L to 20 ìg/L. The current Secchi disk standard of 1.4 meters is not being proposed to change. The rationale for this proposal is that:

- A lake sediment core was collected and analyzed to estimate historic in-lake concentrations of total phosphorus dating back nearly two hundred years and thereby determine natural background levels. The methodology that was employed revealed that prior to European settlement of the area (believed to be from about 1850 to 1880) when land use began to change (i.e., farming began in earnest) total phosphorus was approximately 60 ìg/L. It is reasonable to consider this a natural background condition and, therefore, an appropriate level for Spring Lake to achieve.
- The lake sediment core could not be used to provide historic chlorophyll-a levels. Instead to determine an appropriate target for that parameter the MPCA used a statistical approach to relate the response of chlorophyll-a to total phosphorus concentrations. A statewide lakes dataset was used for this analysis and revealed that 20 ìg/L is an appropriate target for Spring Lake.
- For the Secchi disk target setting a method similar to chlorophyll-a was used. This analysis indicated that 1.4 meters, the current Secchi disk standard, remains an appropriate target for Spring Lake.
- Through this analysis MPCA staff concluded that the beneficial use of aquatic recreation will be protected if the proposed site-specific standard is adopted and attained.
