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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Expedited Emergency Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited emergency rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Expedited emergency rules are effective upon publication in the State Register, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions.

Expedited emergency rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited emergency rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: 2015 Beaver Season Extension

6234.1900 TAKING BEAVER.

[For text of subps 1 and 2, see 39 SR 172]

Subp. 3. Beaver season extension in North Zone. Beaver may be taken and possessed without limit from May 1 to May 15 under the following conditions in that portion of the state described in part 6234.1000, subpart 3:

A. foothold traps must be set in at least eight inches of water;

B. body-gripping traps must be completely submerged as described in part 6234.0900, subpart 5. Body-gripping traps with a jaw opening greater than 7.5 inches must be set with the trigger wires moved all the way to one side of the trap; and

C. snares must be set with stops affixed to the cable to ensure that the portion of the snare that makes up the noose loop may not be less than four inches in diameter when fully closed.

EFFECTIVE PERIOD. Minnesota Rules, part 6234.1900, subpart 3, expires December 31, 2015.

Executive Orders

The governor has the authority to issue written statements or orders, called Executive Orders. as well as Emergency Executive Orders. The governor's authority is specified in the *Constitution of the State of Minnesota*, Article V, and in *Minnesota Statutes* § 4.035. Emergency Executive Orders, for protection from an imminent threat to health and safety, become effective immediately, are filed with the secretary of state, and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after they are issued. Other Executive Orders become effective 15 days after publication in the *State Register* and filing with the secretary of state. Unless otherwise specified, an executive order expires 90 days after the date the governor who issued the order vacates office.

Emergency Executive Order 15 - 07: Providing for Assistance to the Minnesota Interagency Fire Center

I, MARK DAYTON, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, do hereby issue this Executive Order:

WHEREAS, on Wednesday, April 15th, the Minnesota Interagency Fire Center (MIFC) was managing suppression of more than thirty-five wildfires;

WHEREAS, the National Weather Service has issued Red Flag Fire weather warnings for all of Minnesota, due to dry conditions, high temperatures, low humidity, and strong winds that have been exacerbated by the lack significant precipitation, and these conditions are expected to remain extreme for the next several days;

WHEREAS, interstate support is unavailable at this time due to similar conditions across the region;

WHEREAS, state agencies, the State Emergency Operations Center, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, and the MIFC do not have adequate aviation resources for widespread wildfire suppression; and

WHEREAS, the MIFC has requested fire suppression and support assets from the Minnesota National Guard.

NOW, THEREFORE, I hereby order that:

- The Adjutant General of Minnesota order to state active duty on or about April 15th, 2015, in the service of the State, such
 personnel and equipment of the military forces of the State as required and for such period of time as necessary to support
 wildfire suppression in Minnesota.
- 2. The Adjutant General is authorized to purchase, lease, or contract goods and services necessary to accomplish the mission.
- 3. The cost of subsistence, transportation, fuel, pay, and allowances of said individuals shall be defrayed from the general fund of the State, as provided for in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 192.49, 192.52, 192.54, and as otherwise permitted by law.

Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 4.035, subdivision 2, this Emergency Order is effective immediately and will remain in effect until such date as elements of the military forces of the State are no longer required.

Executive Order 15-08: Directing the Minnesota Department of Transportation to Utilize Certain Special Characters on Roadway Signage

I, MARK DAYTON, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, do hereby issue this Executive Order:

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota has a diverse and rich cultural background;

WHEREAS, the naming of a city is a significant and thoughtful process;

WHEREAS, the accurate representation of the intent of a city's efforts to name their city is important;

WHEREAS, characters not found among the standard English characters may be present in the name of the person or place after which the city is being named; and

WHEREAS, when naming a city after an influential person or place it may be necessary to utilize special characters to accurately identify that person or place.

NOW, THEREFORE, I hereby order that:

- 1. The Minnesota Department of Transportation be exempted from the standards set forward in the Standard Alphabets for Traffic Control Devices, imposed in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 169.06, subdivision 1, as they relate to signage identifying cities whose name includes special characters.
- 2. This order only applies to city name boundary signs.

Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 4.035, subdivision 2, this executive order will be effective fifteen (15) days after publication in the State Register and filing with the Secretary of State and will remain in effect, in accordance with *Minnesota Statutes*, section 4.035, subdivision 3.

Minnesota Statute section 161.315 prohibits the Commissioner, counties, towns, or home rule or statutory cities from awarding or approving the award of a contract for goods or services to a person who is suspended or debarred, including:

- 2) any business or affiliate which the debarred or suspended person exercises substantial influence or control, and

State Grants & Loans

Minnesota State Colleges & Universities is authorized to provide, under the auspices of the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006, assistance to **institutions serving individuals with disabilities or offenders to support career and technical education services and activities**. Currently MnSCU is requesting proposals from institutions that meet the following eligibility:

- 1. Correctional institutions (i.e. adult or youth facilities);
- 2. Entities providing services to individuals transitioning from correctional facilities including group transitional facilities or other organizations serving ex-offenders;
- 3. State institutions serving individuals with disabilities;

This initiative has two primary goals to address persistent disparities among these populations: (1) To provide assistance to institutions which will assist persons through career and technical education services and activities that will upgrade the skills and increase career opportunities in order to increase personal economic self-sufficiency and (2) To assist in the development of career and technical education services and activities, which could be **replicated or adopted** elsewhere in the State.
