NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Expedited Emergency Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited emergency rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Expedited emergency rules are effective upon publication in the State Register, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions.

Expedited emergency rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited emergency rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: Mille Lacs Lake Fishing

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the above entitled rules have been adopted through the process prescribed by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.027, subd. 13 (b). The statutory authority for the contents of the rule is *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.045, subd. 2; 97C.005; and 97C.401.

The emergency conditions that do not allow compliance with *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.0451 to 97A.0459, are that under the terms of the Federal District Court the Mille Lacs Band, Fond Du Lac Band, and six Wisconsin Bands of Chippewa are not required to declare their harvest intentions on inland waters until mid-March. The Mille Lacs proposed regulations are based on a safe harvest level determined for 2015. Final harvest threshold levels to be included in the proposed rules were not available until March. These new threshold levels and regulations need to be put in place as soon as possible to ensure that angler harvest does not exceed state angler harvest thresholds for the 2015 open water fishing season.

6264.0400 DESIGNATED SPECIAL MANAGEMENT WATERS.

Subp. 4. Mille Lacs Lake and associated tributaries special management regulations.

[For text of items A and B, see 39 SR 1539]

C. Mille Lacs Lake is closed to the taking of fish between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. daily during the period commencing at 10 p.m. on the Monday following the Saturday two weeks prior to the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend and ending at 12:01 a.m. on December 1. During the closure, no person shall be on the waters of Mille Lacs Lake while having in possession any equipment whereby fish may be taken; except as provided in this item. Beginning June 8, fishing equipment is allowed in possession but may not be used for fishing with the following exceptions:

(1) beginning June 8, fishing for muskellunge is allowed between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. Only artificial muskellunge lures greater than eight inches in length, measured from the front of the eye of the lure to the end of the trailing hook, or sucker minnows greater than eight inches in length may be used or in possession. While fishing for muskellunge under this subitem, no person may have in possession tackle or bait other than that specifically used for muskellunge. Angling for, harvest of, and possession of species other than muskellunge are prohibited; and

(2) beginning June 8, bowfishing for rough fish is allowed between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. No person shall have in possession any angling equipment while bowfishing under this subitem. Angling for, harvest of, and possession of species other than rough fish while bowfishing are prohibited.

Description of Projects and Proposed Funding:

Blattner Energy, Inc. (BEI)_may expand at 392 County Road 50, Avon (Stearns County), Minnesota. The company specializes in the construction of alternative energy facilities. BEI is the country's largest installer of wind energy projects. The company also constructs solar energy and power transmission line projects. The potential project involves expanding its headquarters in Avon by 20,296 square feet. The company expects to create 12 jobs at an average cash wage of \$19.50 per hour and make a capital investment of \$6,200,000, all of which is eligible for a capital investment rebate. The project is eligible for a job creation award of up to \$68,000 and a capital investment rebate of up to \$465,000.

Uponor Inc, may expand its campus in Apple Valley (Dakota County), Minnesota. The company is the leading provider of plumbing and indoor climate solutions for the international building markets. The potential project involves expanding its Annex building from 36,000 square feet to 86,000 square feet. The company expects to create 82 jobs at an average cash wage of \$20.54 per hour and make a capital investment of \$18,000,000 with \$12,300,000 eligible for a capital investment rebate. The project is eligible for a job creation award of up to \$340,000 and a capital investment rebate of up to \$500,000.

Ally Servicing, Inc., a subsidiary of Ally Financial Inc., may expand at 4000 Lexington Ave. N, Shoreview (Ramsey County), Minnesota. Ally Financial is one of the largest providers of automotive financing products and services in the United States. The potential project involves Ally Servicing consolidating and expanding their operations in Minnesota by leasing additional space and adding employment. The company expects to create 247 full-time permanent positions at an average cash wage of \$16.48 per hour and make an eligible capital investment of \$2,966,036. The project is eligible for a job creation award of up to \$500,000 and a capital investment rebate of up to \$148,301.

Syngenta Seeds Inc., may expand at 317 Highway 19 Blvd, Stanton (Goodhue County), Minnesota. The company is committed to sustainable agriculture and is engaged in discovery, development, manufacturing and marketing of crop protection and seed products. The potential project involves its operations in Stanton with an addition of approximately 20,000 square foot of operations, development and laboratory. The company expects to create 12 jobs at an average cash wage of \$31.25 per hour and make a capital investment of \$16,000,000 The project is eligible for a Greater Minnesota Job Expansion award of up to \$779,625.

On July 22, 2014 the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) approved a one-year extension of the Minnesota Family Planning Program Section 1115 waiver. This waiver extension has allowed Minnesota to continue to receive federal matching funds for family planning services to men and women, age 15 to 50, who have family incomes at or below 200 percent of the federal poverty level and who are not enrolled in any other Minnesota health care program administered by the Department of Human Services. Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) Health Care Administration

Post-Award Public Forum on the Prepaid Medical Assistance Project Plus Section 1115 Medicaid Waiver

On December 30, 2014 the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) approved a one-year extension of Minnesota's Prepaid Medical Assistance Project Plus (PMAP+) Section 1115 waiver through December 31, 2015. The Department of Human Services has secured CMS approval for BHP funding to run the MinnesotaCare program effective January 1, 2015. Even though the PMAP+ waiver is no longer necessary to continue the Minnesota Care program, several aspects of the PMAP+ waiver are still necessary. The PMAP+ waiver extension effective January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015 provides federal authority for the following:

• Medical Assistance for groups not included in Minnesota's Medicaid state plan; specifically, children ages 12 through 23 months with incomes above 275 percent of poverty and at or below 283 percent of poverty, and parents and caretaker adults with incomes at or below 133 percent of poverty who assume responsibility for and live with an 18-year-old child who is not a full-time secondary school student;

- · Full Medical Assistance benefits for pregnant women during the period of presumptive eligibility;
- Mandatory enrollment of certain groups into prepaid managed care; and
- · Payments for graduate medical education costs through the MERC fund.

Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) Resource Management and Assistance Division Notice of Availability and Request for Comments on Draft Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the Proposed A-Mill Artist Lofts Hydroelectric Project, Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Project No. 14628-000

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Commissioner of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA), pursuant to *Minnesota Rules* 7001.1440, has made a preliminary determination to issue a Clean Water Act (CWA) Section 401 Water Quality Certification (401 Certification) with conditions for the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) proposed license of the A-Mill Artist Lofts Hydroelectric Project. The MPCA is proposing to issue a Section 401 Certification to the applicant, the Minneapolis Leased Housing Associates IV, Limited Partnership. The Section 401 Certification is necessary to complete the FERC licensing process.

The proposed project is located in the Mississippi River within the city limits of Minneapolis, Minnesota. The project is primarily for electric power generation and will provide 6.0 megawatts (MW) of electricity to meet the electrical needs of 251 apartment units. The potential significant project impacts are fish entrainment. In addition, there may be an increase in sedimentation/turbidity during project construction.

The MPCA requests comments on its preliminary 401 Certification for the A-Mill Artist Lofts.

Public Comment Period. Interested persons are invited to submit written comments on the MPCA's proposed Draft 401 Certification for the project. Written comments may be submitted to the MPCA contact person at the address, facsimile number, or e-mail address listed above.

The public comment period begins on May 11, 2015, and ends at 4:30 p.m. on May 26, 2015.

Written comments must include the following:

- 1. A statement of your interest in the MPCA's draft 401 Certification.
- 2. A statement of the action you wish the MPCA to take, including specific references to sections of the draft Certification that you believe should be changed.
- 3. The reasons supporting your position, stated with sufficient specificity as to allow the Commissioner to investigate the merits of your position.

Petition for Public Informational Meeting

You also may request that the MPCA Commissioner hold a public informational meeting. A public informational meeting is an informal meeting to solicit public comment and statements on matters before the MPCA, and to help clarify and resolve issues. A petition requesting a public informational meeting must include the following information:

- 1. A statement identifying the matter of concern.
- 2. The information required under items 1 through 3 of "Written Comments," identified above.
- 3. A statement of the reasons the MPCA should hold a public informational meeting.
- 4. The issues that you would like the MPCA to address at the public informational meeting.

Petition for Contested Case Hearing

You also may submit a petition for a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a formal evidentiary hearing before an administrative law judge. In accordance with *Minnesota Rules* 7000.1900, the MPCA will grant a petition to hold a contested case hearing if it finds that:

- 1. There is a material issue of fact in dispute concerning the draft Certification;
- 2. The MPCA has the jurisdiction to make a determination on the disputed material issue of fact; and

3. There is a reasonable basis underlying the disputed material issue of fact or facts such that the holding of the contested case hearing would allow the introduction of information that would aid the MPCA in resolving the disputed facts in making a final decision on the draft Certification. A material issue of fact means a fact question, as distinguished from a policy question, whose resolution could have a direct bearing on a final MPCA decision.

A petition for a contested case hearing must include the following information:

- 1. A statement of reasons or proposed findings supporting the MPCA decision to hold a contested case hearing according to the criteria in *Minnesota Rule* 7000.1900, as discussed above.
- 2. A statement of the issues proposed to be addressed by a contested case hearing and the specific relief requested or resolution of the matter.

In addition and to the extent known, a petition for a contested case hearing should also include the following information:

- 1. A proposed list of prospective witnesses to be called, including experts, with a brief description of proposed testimony or summary of evidence to be presented at a contested case hearing.
- 2. A proposed list of publications, references, or studies to be introduced and relied upon at a contested case hearing.
- 3. An estimate of time required for you to present the matter at a contested case hearing.

MPCA Decision

You may submit a petition to the Commissioner requesting that the MPCA Citizens' Board (Board) consider the 401 Certification. To be considered timely, the petition must be received by the MPCA by 4:30 p.m. on the date the public comment period ends. Under the provisions of *Minnesota Statute* 116.02, subd. 6(4), the decision whether to issue the Certification and, if so, under what terms will be presented to the Board for decision if:

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- 1. The Commissioner grants the petition requesting the matter be presented to the Board;
- 2. One or more Board members request to hear the matter before the time the Commissioner makes a final decision on the Certification; or
- 3. A timely request for a contested case hearing is pending. You may participate in the activities of the Board as provided in *Minnesota Rule* 7000.0650.

The written comments, requests, and petitions submitted on or before the last day of the comment period will be considered in the final decision on this Certification. If the MPCA does not receive written comments, requests, or petitions during the public comment period, MPCA staff, as authorized by the Board, will make the final decision on the draft Certification.
