1.2 relating to public safety; adding fifth degree assault and certain domestic assault
1.3 provisions to crime of violence; amending Minnesota Statutes 2010, section

1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 624.712, subdivision 5, is amended to read:

1.7 Subd. 5. **Crime of violence.** "Crime of violence" means: felony convictions of the
1.8 following offenses: sections 609.185 (murder in the first degree); 609.19 (murder in
1.9 the second degree); 609.195 (murder in the third degree); 609.20 (manslaughter in the
1.10 first degree); 609.205 (manslaughter in the second degree); 609.215 (aiding suicide and
1.11 aiding attempted suicide); 609.221 (assault in the first degree); 609.222 (assault in the
1.12 second degree); 609.223 (assault in the third degree); 609.2231 (assault in the fourth
1.13 degree); 609.224 (assault in the fifth degree); 609.2242 (domestic assault); 609.2247
1.14 (domestic assault by strangulation); 609.229 (crimes committed for the benefit of a
1.15 gang); 609.235 (use of drugs to injure or facilitate crime); 609.24 (simple robbery);
1.16 609.245 (aggravated robbery); 609.25 (kidnapping); 609.255 (false imprisonment);
1.17 609.322 (solicitation, inducement, and promotion of prostitution; sex trafficking); 609.342
1.18 (criminal sexual conduct in the first degree); 609.343 (criminal sexual conduct in the
1.19 second degree); 609.344 (criminal sexual conduct in the third degree); 609.345 (criminal
1.20 sexual conduct in the fourth degree); 609.377 (malicious punishment of a child); 609.378
1.21 (neglect or endangerment of a child); 609.486 (commission of crime while wearing or
1.22 possessing a bullet-resistant vest); 609.52 (involving theft of a firearm, theft involving
1.23 the intentional taking or driving of a motor vehicle without the consent of the owner or
1.24 authorized agent of the owner, theft involving the taking of property from a burning,

2.1 abandoned, or vacant building, or from an area of destruction caused by civil disaster,
2.2 riot, bombing, or the proximity of battle, and theft involving the theft of a controlled
2.3 substance, an explosive, or an incendiary device); 609.561 (arson in the first degree);
2.4 609.562 (arson in the second degree); 609.582, subdivision 1, 2, or 3 (burglary in the first
2.5 through third degrees); 609.66, subdivision 1e (drive-by shooting); 609.67 (unlawfully
2.6 owning, possessing, operating a machine gun or short-barreled shotgun); 609.71 (riot);
2.7 609.713 (terroristic threats); 609.749 (stalking); 609.855, subdivision 5 (shooting at a
2.8 public transit vehicle or facility); and chapter 152 (drugs, controlled substances); and an
2.9 attempt to commit any of these offenses.

2.10 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective August 1, 2012, and applies to crimes
2.11 committed on or after that date.
