relating to public safety; requiring updated policies regarding the use of force by 1 2 peace officers; amending Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 626.8452, subdivisions 1.3 2, 4, by adding a subdivision. 1.4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 626.8452, is amended by adding a subdivision 1.6 to read: 1.7

Subd. 1a. Updated policies required. (a) By September 1, 2020, the board, in consultation with interested parties, shall adopt an updated comprehensive written model policy on the use of force, including deadly force, by peace officers, and distribute this policy to the chief law enforcement officer of every law enforcement agency in the state. The model policy must recognize and respect the sanctity and value of all human life and the need to treat everyone with dignity and without prejudice. At a minimum, the policy must address:

- (1) a duty for peace officers to intercede when present and observing another peace officer using force that is clearly beyond what is objectively reasonable under the law and the particular circumstances of the case, and in a position to do so;
- (2) a duty for peace officers to report any illegal use of force by another peace officer to the officer's chief law enforcement officer; and
- (3) a prohibition on the use by peace officers of neck restraints, carotid controls, and 1.20 chokeholds. 1.21

Section 1. 1

At a minimum, the policy must ban the use of neck restraints, carotid controls, and 2.1 chokeholds in all cases except where the person upon whom the action is taken is committing 2.2 a violent act that imminently threatens the life of the peace officer or another person, and 2.3 require that even in those circumstances, less lethal measures be considered first by the 2.4 officer. 2.5 (b) By November 1, 2020, each chief law enforcement officer shall establish and enforce 2.6 an updated comprehensive written policy on the use of force, including deadly force, by 2.7 officers within the agency that is identical or substantively similar to the model policy 2.8 required in paragraph (a). Each chief law enforcement officer shall certify to the board that 2.9 the policy has been established in compliance with this paragraph. Chief law enforcement 2.10 officers shall ensure that each officer in the agency receives a copy of the policy and adheres 2.11 2.12 to it. (c) The board has authority to inspect law enforcement agency policies to ensure 2.13 compliance with paragraph (b). The board may conduct this inspection based upon a 2.14 complaint it receives about a particular agency or through a random selection process. 2.15 2.16 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 626.8452, subdivision 2, is amended to read: Subd. 2. Deadly force and firearms use; initial instruction. Beginning January 1, 2.17 1992, the head of every local and state law enforcement agency shall provide instruction 2.18 on the use of force, deadly force, and the use of firearms to every peace officer and part-time 2.19 peace officer newly appointed by or beginning employment with the agency. This instruction 2.20 must occur before the agency head issues a firearm to the officer or otherwise authorizes 2.21 the officer to carry a firearm in the course of employment. The instruction must be based 2.22 on the agency's written policy required in subdivision subdivisions 1 and 1a and on the 2.23 instructional materials required by the board for peace officer and part-time peace officer 2.24 licensure. 2.25 Sec. 3.
