BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 62A.28, subdivision 2, is amended to read:

Subd. 2. **Required coverage.** (a) Every policy, plan, certificate, or contract referred to

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in subdivision 1 issued or renewed after August 1, 1987, must provide coverage for scalp

hair prostheses worn for hair loss suffered as a result of alopecia areata or treatment for

cancer.

(b) The coverage required by this section is subject to the co-payment, coinsurance,

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deductible, and other enrollee cost-sharing requirements that apply to similar types of items

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under the policy, plan, certificate, or contract and may be limited to one prosthesis per

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benefit year.

(c) The coverage required by this section for scalp hair prostheses, worn for hair loss

suffered as a result of treatment for cancer is limited to \$1,000 per benefit year.

(d) A scalp hair prostheses must be prescribed by a doctor to be covered under this

(e) Scalp hair prostheses worn for hair loss suffered as a result of treatment for cancer

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are covered by county-based purchasing plans participating in the medical assistance program.

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EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective January 1, 2025, and applies to all policies,
