1.6	Section 1. [144.1914] DENTAL ASSISTING AND HYGIENE EDUCATION
1.7	PROGRAM EXPANDED-CAPACITY GRANTS AND FORGIVABLE LOANS.
1.8	Subdivision 1. Grant and loan program established. The commissioner of health shall
1.9	make grants and forgivable loans available to dental assisting higher education programs
1.10	and dental hygiene higher education programs that are accredited by the Commission on
1.11	Dental Accreditation for eligible projects to expand student enrollment capacity. The
