Upon such request, a landlord must make reasonable 1.11 modifications to policies, practices, or procedures for the rental property, or make reasonable 1.12 modifications to the property or facilities on the property, unless the modifications would 1.13 fundamentally alter the nature of the facilities or other structural aspects of the property. 1.14 (b) A landlord may require documentation from a tenant that the child is autistic unless 1.15 the child's condition is readily apparent or already known to the landlord. 1.16

(c) A landlord who receives or accommodates a request for a reasonable accommodation

under this section may not retaliate in any way against the tenant.
