Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 122A.441, is amended to read: 1.5 122A.441 SHORT-CALL SUBSTITUTE TEACHER PILOT PROGRAM. 1.6 (a) A school district or charter school and applicant may jointly request the Professional 1.7 Educator Licensing and Standards Board approve an application for a short-call substitute 1.8 teaching license. Section 1. 1 license in accordance with section 122A.18, subdivision 7a, paragraph (a), must not be required to complete a joint application with a district and must not be issued a license pending a background check under section 122A.18, subdivision 8.

- (c) The board may prioritize short-call substitute teaching license applications to expedite the review process.
- (d) A school district or charter school must provide a substitute teacher who receives a substitute teaching license through the pilot program with substitute teacher training. The board may remove a school district or charter school from the pilot program for failure to provide the required training.
- (e) A school district or charter school must not require an employee to apply for a substitute teaching license, or retaliate against an employee that does not apply for a substitute teaching license under the pilot program.
- (f) A school district or charter school must compensate an employee working as a short-call substitute teacher under the pilot program with the greater of \$200 per day \$175 per day for districts or charter schools located in one of the seven counties in the metro equity region under section 126C.10, subdivision 28, or \$150 per day for all other districts or charter schools, or the employee's regular rate of pay.
