1.1 A bill for an act
1.2 relating to public safety; establishing a task force on standardized identification
1.3 for emergency responders; requiring a report; appropriating money.

1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.5 Section 1. TASK FORCE ON STANDARDIZED IDENTIFICATION FOR
1.6 EMERGENCY RESPONDERS.

1.7 Subdivision 1. Establishment. The Task Force on Standardized Identification for
1.8 Emergency Responders is established to develop a plan to create a standard form of
1.9 identification for use by emergency responders in the state and to make policy and funding
1.10 recommendations to the legislature.

1.11 Subd. 2. Membership. (a) The task force consists of the following members:

- 1.12 (1) the commissioner of public safety, or a designee;
1.13 (2) the chief of the Minnesota State Patrol, or a designee;
1.14 (3) the state fire marshal, or a designee;
1.15 (4) the superintendent of the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension, or a designee;
1.16 (5) the director of Driver and Vehicle Services, or a designee;
1.17 (6) the director of the Board of Peace Officer Standards and Training, or a designee;
1.18 (7) the director of the Minnesota Office of Emergency Medical Services, or a designee;
1.19 (8) the chair of the Metropolitan Airports Commission, or a designee;

2.1 (9) a representative from the Minnesota Chiefs of Police Association, appointed by the
2.2 president of the association's board of directors;

2.3 (10) a representative from the Minnesota Sheriffs' Association, appointed by the president
2.4 of the association's board of directors;

2.5 (11) a representative from the Minnesota Police and Peace Officers Association, appointed
2.6 by the president of the association's board of directors;

2.7 (12) a representative from the Minnesota State Fire Chiefs Association, appointed by
2.8 the president of the association's board of directors;

2.9 (13) a representative from the Minnesota Professional Fire Fighters Association, appointed
2.10 by the president of the association's board of directors;

2.11 (14) a representative from the Minnesota State Fire Department Association, appointed
2.12 by the president of the association's board of directors; and

2.13 (15) one member with experience working as an employee organization representative
2.14 representing emergency medical service providers, appointed by an employee organization
2.15 representing emergency medical service providers.

2.16 (b) Appointments must be made no later than July 15, 2026.

2.17 (c) Members must serve without compensation.

2.18 (d) Members of the task force serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority or until
2.19 the task force expires. Vacancies must be filled by the appointing authority consistent with
2.20 the qualifications of the vacating member required by this subdivision.

2.21 Subd. 3. **Officers; meetings.** (a) The commissioner of public safety or the commissioner's
2.22 designee must convene the first meeting of the task force by August 1, 2026.

2.23 (b) At the first meeting, the members of the task force must elect a chair and may elect
2.24 other officers as the members deem necessary.

2.25 (c) The task force must meet monthly or as determined by the chair. The task force must
2.26 meet frequently enough to accomplish the tasks identified in this section.

2.27 (d) Meetings of the task force are subject to Minnesota Statutes, chapter 13D.

2.28 Subd. 4. **Duties.** (a) The task force must design a standardized identification for
2.29 emergency responders in the state and prepare a plan to implement mandatory use of a
2.30 standardized identification by emergency responders and their employers.

2.31 (b) The design for the standardized identification must include:

- 3.1 (1) a photograph of the emergency responder;
- 3.2 (2) the name of the emergency responder;
- 3.3 (3) a physical description of the emergency responder;
- 3.4 (4) a clear indication of whether the emergency responder is a peace officer, firefighter,
3.5 emergency medical services provider, or other type of emergency responder; and
- 3.6 (5) information about the emergency responder's certifications and areas of expertise or
3.7 a scannable code that provides access to that information.
- 3.8 (c) The task force may require that other information be included on the standardized
3.9 identification, including but not limited to the name of an employer and a license number.
- 3.10 (d) The task force may recommend that the standardized identification be in the form
3.11 of a physical card, an electronic document, or both.
- 3.12 (e) The task force must consider whether the state should issue the standardized
3.13 identification or establish standards and requirements for identification issued by local units
3.14 of government and other employers.
- 3.15 (f) At a minimum, the plan to implement mandatory use of a standardized identification
3.16 by emergency responders must:
- 3.17 (1) identify a schedule for issuing identification to current and future emergency
3.18 responders;
- 3.19 (2) make recommendations regarding application procedures, including developing a
3.20 procedure to verify the identity of a recipient;
- 3.21 (3) identify data that must be shared in order to create a standardized identification and
3.22 propose any legislative changes necessary to allow such information to be shared;
- 3.23 (4) make recommendations regarding renewal of a standardized identification;
- 3.24 (5) make recommendations regarding updating information for emergency responders;
- 3.25 (6) make recommendations for policies and procedures to address situations when a
3.26 person's license or other authorization is suspended, revoked, or canceled; and
- 3.27 (7) make recommendations regarding the collection, destruction, deletion, or other
3.28 invalidation of a standardized identification when a person no longer works as an emergency
3.29 responder.
- 3.30 Subd. 5. **Report.** By January 15, 2027, the task force must submit a report to the chairs
3.31 and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over public

4.1 safety on the work of the task force including any recommendations for legislation or
4.2 funding.

4.3 Subd. 6. **Expiration.** The task force expires the day after submitting the report required
4.4 under subdivision 5.
