1.1 A bill for an act

1.2 relating to education; limiting access to school sites; amending Minnesota Statutes

1.3 2024, section 123B.51, by adding a subdivision.

1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.5 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 123B.51, is amended by adding a subdivision

1.6 to read:

1.7 Subd. 8. Limits on access by officials engaged in immigration enforcement. (a) A

1.8 school district or charter school employee must not consent to a federal, state, or local

1.9 official entering a school site for purposes of immigration enforcement unless the official

1.10 provides the school employee with a valid judicial warrant. The school employee must

1.11 request the federal, state, or local official to provide valid identification, and must grant

1.12 entry to only the areas identified in the judicial warrant.

1.13 (b) A school employee granting entry to a federal, state, or local official engaged in

1.14 immigration enforcement must immediately notify the district superintendent or person

1.15 having administrative control of a charter school, and the district or charter school's general

1.16 counsel or other designated legal representative.

1.17 (c) This subdivision does not prohibit entry by a federal, state, or local official

1.18 administering a state or federally supported educational program.

1.19 EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment.

2.1 Sec. 2. **SEVERABILITY.**

2.2 If application of this act to any person, entity, or circumstance is found to be
2.3 unconstitutional and void, the remaining provisions of the law shall remain valid as applied
2.4 to any other person, entity, or circumstance.
