1.11 1.12	Section 1. <u>COMMISSIONER OF HUMAN SERVICES; EXTENSION OF COVID-19</u> HUMAN SERVICES PROGRAM WAIVERS AND MODIFICATIONS.
1.13	Subdivision 1. Waivers and modifications; federal funding extension. When the

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 that the portion of this modification permitting personal care assistance workers to bill 310 hours per month shall expire upon the expiration of the peacetime emergency. Subd. 3. Waivers and modifications; 60-day transition period. When the peacetime emergency declared by the governor in response to the COVID-19 outbreak expires, is terminated, or is rescinded by the proper authority, all waivers or modifications issued by the commissioner of human services in response to the COVID-19 outbreak that have not been extended as provided in subdivisions 1 and 2 of this section may remain in effect for no more than 60 days, only for purposes of transitioning affected programs back to operating without the waivers or modifications in place. EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment. Sec. 2. EXTENSION OF MEDICAL CANNABIS PROGRAM TELEMEDICINE FLEXIBILITIES. When the peacetime emergency declared by the governor in response to the COVID-19
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outbreak expires, is terminated, or is rescinded by the proper authority, the provisions in
Executive Order 20-26 authorizing the use of telemedicine in the medical cannabis program
to conduct patient assessments to certify patient qualifying medical conditions, and to
perform consultations between patients or caregivers and manufacturer employees licensed
as pharmacists before the distribution of medical cannabis, shall remain in effect until June
<u>30, 2021.</u>
EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment.
Sec. 3. APPROPRIATION; HOUSING SUPPORT TEMPORARY ABSENCE
POLICY MODIFICATION EXTENSION.
\$ in fiscal year 2020 and \$ in fiscal year 2021 are appropriated from the
coronavirus relief fund to the commissioner of human services for extending the modification
to the housing support temporary absence policy in section 1, subdivision 2, clause (5).
EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment.

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
