Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2012, section 126C.20, is amended to read:

126C.20 ANNUAL GENERAL EDUCATION AID APPROPRIATION.

There is annually appropriated from the general fund to the department the amount necessary for general education aid under section 126C.13, concurrent enrollment aid under section 124D.091, the early graduation achievement scholarship program under section 120B.08, and the early graduation military service award program under section 120B.09. This amount must be reduced by the amount of any money specifically appropriated for the same purpose in any year from any state fund.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective for revenue for fiscal years 2014 and later.
