1.5 Section 1. [16F.01] MINNESOTA YOUTH COUNCIL.

1.6 <u>Subdivision 1.</u> Establishment and membership. The Minnesota Youth Council

1.7 <u>is established within and under the auspices of the Minnesota Alliance With Youth.</u>

1.8 The council consists of four members from each congressional district in Minnesota

1.9 and four members selected at large. Members must be selected through an application

1.10 and interview process conducted by the Minnesota Alliance With Youth. In making its

1.11 appointments, the Minnesota Alliance With Youth should strive to ensure gender and

1.12 <u>ethnic diversity in the council's membership</u>. Members must be between the ages of 13
