1.1 A bill for an act

relating to state government; appropriating money for state employee salaries in the event of nonappropriation; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 16A.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. [16A.1335] APPROPRIATIONS FOR STATE EMPLOYEE SALARIES AND BENEFITS IN EVENT OF NONAPPROPRIATION.

Subdivision 1. Appropriation; agencies. If, by July 1 of an odd-numbered year, legislation has not been enacted to appropriate money for the biennium beginning on that July 1 to an agency for regular operations, the amount necessary to pay salaries and employment benefits for the agency's employees for one fiscal year is appropriated annually beginning on that July 1 to the agency. The appropriation is to be made from the fund from which an appropriation was made in the second year of the biennium ending June 30 of the same year for salary and employment benefits paid to the agency's employees.

Subd. 2. Appropriation; legislature. If, by July 1 of an odd-numbered year, legislation has not been enacted to appropriate money for the biennium beginning on that July 1 to the house of representatives, the senate, and the Legislative Coordinating Commission for the joint offices and commissions of the legislature for regular operations, the amounts necessary to pay salaries and employment benefits for employees are appropriated on that July 1 to the house of representatives, the senate, and the Legislative Coordinating Commission for salary and benefits for each entity's respective employees in an amount certified under subdivision 4. The appropriation is to be made from the fund from which an appropriation
