BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.8	BE IT ENACTED BT THE LEOISLATORE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA.
1.9	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 148.925, subdivision 5, is amended to read:
1.10	Subd. 5. Supervisory consultation for an applicant for licensure as a licensed
1.11	psychologist. Supervision of an applicant for licensure as a licensed psychologist must total
1.12	100 hours and must include two hours per week of regularly scheduled in-person
1.13	consultations or consultations provided through telesupervision. For full-time experience,
1.14	one hour must be with the primary supervisor on an individual basis. The remaining hour
1.15	may be with a designated supervisor. The board may approve an exception to the weekly
1.16	supervision requirement for a week when the supervisor was ill or otherwise unable to
1.17	provide supervision. The board may prorate the two hours per week of supervision for
1.18	individuals preparing for licensure on a part-time basis. The board must allow an applicant
1.19	to satisfy the requirement for postdegree supervised psychological employment with all
1.20	required hours of supervision provided through telesupervision. Supervised psychological
1.21	employment does not qualify for licensure when the supervisory consultation is not adequate
1.22	as described in subdivision 1, or in the board rules. The board shall not require a supervisee
1.23	to have more than two hours of supervision per week for the purpose of obtaining a license,
1.24	unless the supervisee is making up missed hours as permitted by the board.

- (b) The supervision must have been received under a contract that defines clinical practice
 and supervision from a mental health professional who is qualified according to section
 245I.04, subdivision 2, or by a board-approved supervisor, who has at least two years of
 postlicensure experience in the delivery of clinical services in the diagnosis and treatment
 of mental illnesses and disorders. All supervisors must meet the supervisor requirements in
 Minnesota Rules, part 2150.5010.
- (c) The supervision must be obtained at the rate of two hours of supervision per 40 hours
 of professional practice. The supervision must be evenly distributed over the course of the
 supervised professional practice. At least 75 percent of the required supervision hours must
 be received in person or through real-time, two-way interactive audio and visual
- 2.28 communication, and the board must allow an applicant to satisfy this supervision requirement
- 2.29 with all required hours of supervision received through real-time, two-way interactive audio
- 2.30 <u>and visual communication</u>. The remaining 25 percent of the required hours may be received
- 2.31 by telephone or by audio or audiovisual electronic device. At least 50 percent of the required
