Section 1. [256.9951] COLLABORATIVE SERVICES FOR HIGH-RISK

CHILDREN AND YOUTH.

In order to provide early intervention collaborative services to children and youth

1.9

who are at high risk for child maltreatment, substance abuse, mental illness, or committing

1.10

serious and violent offenses, the commissioner of human services shall fund one or

1.11

more projects that identify and serve these children and youth. Projects must utilize all

1.12

available funding streams. The projects that are funded must include the following

program components:

- (1) identification of high-risk children and youth using multidimensional screening
- 1.15
- instruments;
- 1.16
- (2) multidisciplinary and multijurisdictional collaborative services;
- 1.17
- (3) an integrated information system;
- 1.18
- (4) intensive in-home and in-community casework;
- 1.19
- (5) continuous tracking of outcomes; and

- (6) multidimensional evaluations and cost-benefit analysis.
