1.9	Subd. 4. Commissioner's powers and duties. The commissioner of natural resources,
1.10	on behalf of the state of Minnesota, shall take all actions, by rule or otherwise, necessary
1.11	to carry out the duties and obligations of the state of Minnesota arising from the
1.12	Memorandum of Agreement, as amended. Powers and duties provided by this subdivision
1.13	apply to payment of money under the Memorandum of Agreement only to the extent and
1.14	to the amount specifically appropriated by the legislature to carry out the terms of the
1.15	Memorandum of Agreement.
1.16	Sec. 2. [97B.202] TREATY OPEN SEASONS.
1.17	If the commissioner does not establish an open season for taking a species of big game,
1.18	a Chippewa Band identified in section 97A.157, subdivision 1, may establish an open season,
1.19	independently of the state, for members of the band to take the species.
