1.6	Subdivision 1. Establishment. (a) The state auditor must convene a Local Government
1.7	Oversight Task Force to discuss and articulate options to streamline, align, and modernize
1.8	local government audits and related requirements.
1.9	(b) The task force must meet at least quarterly. The state auditor must convene the first
1.10	meeting by July 1, 2024, and provide staff and administrative support as necessary. Members
