1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 144.292, subdivision 6, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 6. Cost. (a) When a patient requests a copy of the patient's record for purposes of
1.8	reviewing current medical care, the provider must not charge a fee.
1.9	(b) When a provider or its representative makes copies of patient records upon a patient's
1.10	request under this section, the provider or its representative may charge the patient or the
1.11	patient's representative no more than <del>75 cents per page, plus \$10 for time spent retrieving</del>
1.12	and copying the records, unless other law or a rule or contract provide for a lower maximum
1.13	charge. This limitation does not apply to x-rays. The provider may charge a patient no more
1.14	than the actual cost of reproducing x-rays, plus no more than \$10 for the time spent retrieving
1.15	and copying the x-rays the following amount, unless other law or a rule or contract provide
1.16	for a lower maximum charge:
1.17	(1) for paper copies, \$1 per page, plus \$10 for time spent retrieving and copying the
1.18	records;
1.19	(2) for x-rays, a total of \$30 for retrieving and reproducing x-rays; and
1.20	(3) for electronic copies, a total of \$20 for retrieving the records.

(c) The respective maximum charges of 75 cents per page and \$10 for time provided in

this subdivision are in effect for calendar year 1992 and may be adjusted annually each

calendar year as provided in this subdivision. The permissible maximum charges shall change each year by an amount that reflects the change, as compared to the previous year, in the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers, Minneapolis-St. Paul (CPI-U), published by the Department of Labor. For any copies of paper records provided under paragraph (b), clause (1), a provider or the provider's representative may not charge more than a total of:

- 2.7 (1) \$10 if there are no records available;
- 2.8 (2) \$30 for copies of records of up to 25 pages;
- 2.9 (3) \$50 for copies of records of up to 100 pages;
- 2.10 (4) \$50, plus an additional 20 cents per page for pages 101 and above; or
- 2.11 **(5)** \$500 for any request.

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(d) A provider or its representative may charge the a \$10 retrieval fee, but must not charge a per page fee or x-ray fee to provide copies of records requested by a patient or the patient's authorized representative if the request for copies of records is for purposes of appealing a denial of Social Security disability income or Social Security disability benefits under title II or title XVI of the Social Security Act; except that no fee shall be charged to a patient who is receiving public assistance, or to a patient who is represented by an attorney on behalf of a civil legal services program or a volunteer attorney program based on indigency. For the purpose of further appeals, a patient may receive no more than two medical record updates without charge, but only for medical record information previously not provided. For purposes of this paragraph, a patient's authorized representative does not include units of state government engaged in the adjudication of Social Security disability claims.

2.24 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective January 1, 2025.
