1.7	amendment is adopted, a section shall be added to article I, to read:
1.8	Sec. 18. The state shall make no law abridging the freedom of speech.
1.9	Sec. 2. SUBMISSION TO VOTERS.
1.10	(a) The proposed amendment must be submitted to the people at the 2020 general election.
1.11	If ratified, the amendment is effective January 1, 2021. The question submitted must be:
