3.7	prominently disclosed in the subscription service agreement. A disclosure made by means
3.8	of an insert into the service agreement is deemed a disclosure in the service agreement.
3.9	Subd. 3. Prohibition on destruction of data. No person may knowingly alter or
3.10	delete data on an event data recorder, or knowingly destroy an event data recorder, after
3.11	an accident involving the motor vehicle that resulted in a death or a serious physical
3.12	injury, unless a reasonable amount of time for a peace officer to obtain a search warrant
3.13	has passed since the date of the accident.
3.14	Subd. 4. Penalty. Violation of this section is a misdemeanor.

3.15 EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective August 1, 2013, and applies to motor
3.16 vehicles sold or leased before, on, or after that date.
