A bill for an act 1.1 relating to disaster assistance; authorizing spending to acquire and better public 1.2 land and buildings and other improvements of a capital nature with certain 1.3 conditions; appropriating money; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds. 1.4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. DISASTER RELIEF APPROPRIATIONS.

Subdivision 1. **Appropriations.** The sums shown in the column under "Appropriations" are appropriated from the bond proceeds fund to be spent to acquire and to better publicly owned land and buildings and other public improvements of a capital 19 nature, and from other named funds, for relief as specified in this act from the storms and 1 10 1.11 flooding that occurred on or after June 11, 2014, in the area in Minnesota designated under Presidential Declaration of a Major Disaster FEMA-4182-DR, whether included in the 1.12 original declarations or added later by federal government action, referred to in this act as 1.13 1.14 "the area included in DR-4182." Unless otherwise specified, money appropriated in this act for a capital program or project may be used to pay state agency staff costs that are 1.15 attributed directly to the capital program or project in accordance with accounting policies 1 16 adopted by the commissioner of management and budget. Unless otherwise specified, the 1 17 appropriations in this act are available from the day following final enactment through 1.18 June 30, 2018, except that appropriations of bond proceeds for capital improvements are 1 19 available until the project is completed or abandoned, subject to Minnesota Statutes, 1.20 section 16A.642. The appropriations in this act are onetime. 1.21
