1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 151.01, is amended by adding a subdivision

1.9	Subd. 43. Syringe services provider. "Syringe services provider" means a
1.10	community-based public health program that offers cost-free comprehensive harm reduction
1.11	services including: providing sterile needles, syringes, and other injection equipment; making
1.12	safe disposal containers for needles and syringes available; educating participants and others
1.13	about overdose prevention, safer injection practices, and infectious disease prevention;
1.14	providing blood-borne pathogen testing or referrals to that testing; offering referrals to
1.15	substance use disorder treatment, including medication-assisted treatment; and providing
1.16	referrals to medical treatment and services, mental health programs and services, and other
1.17	social services.

2.4	(iv) registered nurses and licensed practical nurses;
2.5	(v) registered medical technologists;
2.6	(vi) medical interns and residents;
2.7	(vii) licensed drug wholesalers and their employees or agents;
2.8	(viii) licensed hospitals;
2.9	(ix) bona fide hospitals in which animals are treated;
2.10	(x) licensed nursing homes;
2.11	(xi) licensed morticians;
2.12	(xii) syringe and needle manufacturers and their dealers and agents;

- Subd. 18. **Drug paraphernalia.** (a) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (b), "drug paraphernalia" means all equipment, products, and materials of any kind, except those items used in conjunction with permitted uses of controlled substances under this chapter or the Uniform Controlled Substances Act, which are knowingly or intentionally used primarily in (1) manufacturing a controlled substance, (2) injecting, ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing into the human body a controlled substance, (3) testing the strength, effectiveness, or purity of a controlled substance, or (4) enhancing the effect of a controlled substance.
- (b) "Drug paraphernalia" does not include <u>fentanyl test strips</u>; the possession, manufacture, delivery, or sale of hypodermic needles or syringes in accordance with section 151.40, subdivision 2; or the possession of hypodermic syringes or needles or any instrument or implement which can be adapted for subcutaneous injections.
- 3.14 <u>EFFECTIVE DATE.</u> This section is effective August 1, 2021, and applies to crimes committed on or after that date.
