2.14 **208.03 NOMINATION OF PRESIDENTIAL ELECTORS AND ALTERNATES.**

2.15 (a) Presidential electors and alternates for the major political parties of this state shall  
2.16 be nominated by delegate conventions called and held under the supervision of the respective  
2.17 state central committees of the parties of this state. At least 71 days before the general  
2.18 election day the chair of the major political party shall certify to the secretary of state the  
2.19 names of the persons nominated as presidential electors, the names of persons nominated  
2.20 as alternate presidential electors, and the names of the party candidates for president and  
2.21 vice president. The chair shall also certify that the party candidates for president and vice  
2.22 president have no affidavit on file as a candidate for any office in this state at the ensuing  
2.23 general election.

2.24 (b) The party chair's certification of the names of the party's candidates for president  
2.25 and vice president under paragraph (a) must be accompanied by, for each candidate, a  
2.26 complete copy of the candidate's federal income tax returns covering the previous five years  
2.27 and, as applicable, complete copies of the candidate's income tax returns filed in any state  
2.28 covering the previous five years, provided that for each return the candidate's Social Security  
2.29 number and any personal tax identification numbers may be redacted.

2.30 The secretary of state must not accept the party chair's certification of the names of  
2.31 presidential electors and alternates, or the names of the party's candidates for president and  
2.32 vice president, unless the party chair has complied with all requirements of this section in  
2.33 certifying the names.
