1.1A bill for an act

1.2relating to liquor; prohibiting the commissioner of public safety from suspending

1.3or revoking certain licenses due to COVID-related executive order violations;

1.4proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 340A.

1.5BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6Section 1. [340A.4155] NO SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION FOR VIOLATION

1.7OF CERTAIN EXECUTIVE ORDERS.

1.8Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the commissioner or local licensing

1.9authority must not suspend or revoke the following licenses, permits, or cards issued to a

1.10restaurant if the suspension or revocation is due solely to a violation of Executive Order

1.1120-99, paragraph 7.c.iii, or any subsequent order closing places of public accommodation

1.12to ingress, egress, use, and occupancy by members of the public during the peacetime

1.13emergency declared under chapter 12 in response to the COVID-19 pandemic:

1.14(1) an on-sale intoxicating liquor license issued under section 340A.404, subdivision 1,

1.15paragraph (a), clause (2), or subdivision 6, paragraph (a); and

1.16(2) a permit or card issued under section 340A.301, subdivision 7.

1.17EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective retroactively for violations occurring

1.18after November 18, 2020.
