A bill for an act 1.1 relating to veterans; changing the small business set-aside program for 1.2 veteran-owned small businesses; authorizing county set-aside programs 1.3 for veteran-owned small businesses; changing the award to veteran-owned 1.4 businesses in state procurement biddings; adding veterans to special emphasis in 1.5 state job recruitment; increasing credits for veterans in examination ratings in 1.6 hiring; providing civil actions; amending Minnesota Statutes 2010, sections 1.05, 1.7 by adding a subdivision; 16C.16, subdivision 6a; 43A.09; 161.321, subdivisions 1.8 2, 5, by adding subdivisions; 197.455, subdivisions 4, 5; proposing coding for 1.9 new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 375. 1 10 1.11

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

ARTICLE 1 1.12

INCREASED CREDITS FOR VETERANS IN CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYMENT 1.13 AND EMPHASIS ON RECRUITMENT FOR STATE AGENCY EMPLOYMENT

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 1.05, is amended by adding a subdivision 1.15 to read: 1.16

Subd. 5. Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA). An employee, former employee, or prospective employee of the state who is aggrieved by the state's violation of the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act, United States Code, title 38, sections 4301 to 4333, as amended, may bring a civil action against the state in federal court or another court of competent jurisdiction for legal or equitable relief that will effectuate the purposes of that act.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment.

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Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 43A.09, is amended to read:

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The commissioner in cooperation with appointing authorities of all state agencies shall maintain an active recruiting program publicly conducted and designed to attract sufficient numbers of well-qualified people to meet the needs of the civil service, and to enhance the image and public esteem of state service employment. Special emphasis shall be given to recruitment of <u>veterans and protected</u> group members to assist state agencies in meeting affirmative action goals to achieve a balanced work force.

Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 197.455, subdivision 4, is amended to read: Subd. 4. **Nondisabled veteran's credit.** There shall be added to the competitive open examination rating of a nondisabled veteran, who so elects, a credit of five ten points provided that the veteran obtained a passing rating on the examination without

Sec. 4. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 197.455, subdivision 5, is amended to read:

Subd. 5. **Disabled veteran's credit.** There shall be added to the competitive open examination rating of a disabled veteran, who so elects, a credit of ten 15 points provided that the veteran obtained a passing rating on the examination without the addition of the credit points. There shall be added to the competitive promotional examination rating of a disabled veteran, who so elects, a credit of five points provided that (1) the veteran obtained a passing rating on the examination without the addition of the credit points; and (2) the veteran is applying for a first promotion after securing public employment.

PREFERENCE FOR VETERAN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESSES IN STATE PROCUREMENT

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 16C.16, subdivision 6a, is amended to read:

Subd. 6a. **Veteran-owned small businesses.** (a) Except when mandated by the federal government as a condition of receiving federal funds, the commissioner shall award up to a six eight percent preference, but no less than the percentage awarded to any other group under this section, in the amount bid on state procurement to certified small businesses that are majority-owned and operated by:

(1) recently separated veterans who have served in active military service, at any time on or after September 11, 2001, and who have been discharged under honorable

- conditions from active service, as indicated by the person's United States Department of Defense form DD-214 or by the commissioner of veterans affairs;
- (2) veterans with service-connected disabilities, as determined at any time by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs; or
- (3) any other veteran-owned small businesses certified under section 16C.19, paragraph (d).
- (b) The purpose of this designation is to facilitate the transition of veterans from military to civilian life, and to help compensate veterans for their sacrifices, including but not limited to their sacrifice of health and time, to the state and nation during their military service, as well as to enhance economic development within Minnesota.

3.11 ARTICLE 3

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PREFERENCE FOR VETERAN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESSES IN STATE TRANSPORTATION CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS

- Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 161.321, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
- Subd. 2. **Small <u>targeted group</u>** business set-asides. (a) The commissioner may award up to a six percent preference in the amount bid for specified construction work to small targeted group businesses and veteran-owned small businesses.
- (b) The commissioner may designate a contract for construction work for award only to small targeted group businesses if the commissioner determines that at least three small targeted group businesses are likely to bid. The commissioner may designate a contract for construction work for award only to veteran-owned small businesses if the commissioner determines that at least three veteran-owned small businesses are likely to bid.
- (c) The commissioner, as a condition of awarding a construction contract, may set goals that require the prime contractor to subcontract a portion of the contract to small targeted group businesses and veteran-owned small businesses. The commissioner must establish a procedure for granting waivers from the subcontracting requirement when qualified small targeted group businesses and veteran-owned small businesses are not reasonably available. The commissioner may establish financial incentives for prime contractors who exceed the goals for use of subcontractors and financial penalties for prime contractors who fail to meet goals under this paragraph. The subcontracting requirements of this paragraph do not apply to prime contractors who are small targeted group businesses or veteran-owned small businesses.
- (d) The commissioner may award up to a four percent preference in the amount bid on procurement to small businesses located in an economically disadvantaged area as defined in section 16C.16, subdivision 7.

Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 161.321, is amended by adding a subdivision

Subd. 2a. Veteran-owned small business set-asides. (a) The commissioner must

veteran-owned small businesses, except when prohibited by the federal government as a
condition of receiving federal funds. The percentage of preference in bid amount provided
under this subdivision may not be less than the percentage of bid preference provided to
any small targeted group business under subdivision 2.
(b) The commissioner must be as inclusive as possible in specifying contracts for
construction work, as well as for construction-related goods and services, available under
this bid preference program for veteran-owned small businesses. The term "construction"
must be given broad meaning for purposes of specifying and letting contracts for
veteran-owned small businesses and must include, but is not limited to, preplanning,
planning, and all other construction-related professional support services and other work
involving any and all of the stages of the construction process.
(c) The commissioner, as a condition of awarding a construction contract, must
set goals that require the prime contractor to subcontract a portion of the contract to
veteran-owned small businesses. The commissioner must establish a procedure for
granting waivers from the subcontracting requirement when qualified veteran-owned
small businesses are not reasonably available. The commissioner may establish financial
incentives for prime contractors who exceed the goals for use of veteran-owned small
business subcontractors and financial penalties for prime contractors who fail to meet
goals under this paragraph. The subcontracting requirements of this paragraph do not
apply to prime contractors who are veteran-owned small businesses.
(d) The commissioner may designate a contract for construction work for award to
veteran-owned small businesses only if the commissioner determines that at least three
veteran-owned small businesses are likely to bid.

6.29	of business in Minnesota.
6.30	(b) The board, as a condition of awarding a construction contract, may set goals that
6.31	require the prime contractor to subcontract a portion of the contract to veteran-owned
6.32	small businesses. The board must establish a procedure for granting waivers from the
6.33	subcontracting requirement when qualified veteran-owned small businesses are not
6.34	reasonably available. The board may establish financial incentives for prime contractors
6.35	who exceed the goals for use of veteran-owned small business subcontractors and
6.36	financial penalties for prime contractors who fail to meet goals under this paragraph. The

7.1	subcontracting requirements of this paragraph do not apply to prime contractors who are
7.2	veteran-owned small businesses.
7.3	Subd. 4. Awards to small businesses. At least 75 percent of subcontracts awarded
7.4	to veteran-owned small businesses must be performed by the business to which the
7.5	subcontract is awarded or another veteran-owned small business.
7.6	Subd. 5. Awards, limitations. Contracts awarded under this section are subject to
7.7	all limitations adopted by the board.
7.8	Subd. 6. Recourse to other businesses. If the director is unable to award a contract
7.9	under subdivisions 3 and 4, the award may be placed under normal solicitation and award
7.10	statutes and rules.
7.11	Subd. 7. Noncompetitive bids. The board is encouraged to purchase from
7.12	veteran-owned small businesses designated under section 16C.16, subdivision 6a, when
7.13	making purchases that are not subject to competitive bidding procedures.
7.14	Subd. 8. Report to board. The county treasurer shall report to the board on
7.15	compliance with this section. The information must be reported at the time and in the
7.16	manner requested by the board.
7.17	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective July 1, 2012, for contracts awarded

by counties on or after that date.
