1.7 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 3.855, is amended by adding a subdivision

1.8 to read:

1.9 Subd. 5. **Information required.** The commissioner of management and budget must

1.10 submit to the Legislative Coordinating Commission the following information with the

1.11 submission of a collective bargaining agreement or compensation plan under subdivisions

1.12 2 and 3:

1.13 (1) for each agency and for each proposed agreement or plan, a comparison of biennial

1.14 compensation costs under the current agreement or plan to the projected biennial

1.15 compensation costs under the proposed agreement or plan, paid with funds appropriated

1.16 from the general fund;

1.17 (2) for each agency and for each proposed agreement or plan, a comparison of biennial

1.18 compensation costs under the current agreement or plan to the projected biennial

1.19 compensation costs under the proposed agreement or plan, paid with funds appropriated

1.20 from each fund other than the general fund;

1.21 (3) for each agency and for each proposed agreement or plan, an identification of the

1.22 amount of the additional biennial compensation costs that are attributable to salary and

1.23 wages and to the cost of nonsalary and nonwage benefits; and

- 2.1 (4) for each agency, for clauses (1) to (3), the impact of the aggregate of all agreements
- 2.2 and plans being submitted to the commission.
