[136A.1794] AVIATION DEGREE LOAN FORGIVENESS PROGRAM. 16 Subdivision 1. **Definitions.** (a) For purposes of this section, the terms in this subdivision 1.7 have the meanings given them. 1.8 (b) "Qualified aircraft technician" means an individual who (1) has earned an associate's 1.9 or bachelor's degree from a postsecondary institution located in Minnesota, and (2) has 1.10 obtained an aviation mechanic's certificate from the Federal Aviation Administration. 1.11 (c) "Qualified education loan" means a government, commercial, or foundation loan 1.12 used by an individual for actual costs paid for tuition to a postsecondary institution located 1.13 1.14 in Minnesota for a professional flight training degree. (d) "Qualified pilot" means an individual who (1) has earned an associate's or bachelor's 1.15 degree in professional flight training from a postsecondary institution located in Minnesota, 1.16 and (2) is in the process of obtaining or has obtained an airline transport pilot certificate. 1.17 Subd. 2. Creation of account. (a) An aviation degree loan forgiveness program account 1.18 is established to provide qualified pilots and qualified aircraft technicians with financial 1.19 assistance in repaying qualified education loans. The commissioner shall use money from 1.20

the account to establish and administer the aviation degree loan forgiveness program.

(b) Appropriations made to the aviation degree loan forgiveness program account do 2.1 not cancel and are available until expended. 2.2 Subd. 3. **Eligibility.** To be eligible to participate in the loan forgiveness program under 23 this section, an individual must: 2.4 2.5 (1) be a qualified pilot or qualified aircraft technician; (2) have qualified education loans; and 2.6 2.7 (3) submit an application to the commissioner in the form and manner prescribed by the commissioner. 2.8 2.9 Subd. 4. Loan forgiveness. (a) The commissioner may select eligible applicants each year for participation in the aviation degree loan forgiveness program, within the limits of 2.10 available funding. Applicants are responsible for securing their own qualified education 2.11 loans. 2.12 (b) For each year that the participant meets the eligibility requirements under subdivision 2.13 3, the commissioner must make annual disbursements directly to: 2.14 (1) a selected qualified pilot residing in Minnesota of \$5,000 or the balance of the 2.15 participant's qualified education loans, whichever is less; 2.16 (2) a selected qualified pilot who is not residing in Minnesota of \$2,500 or the balance 2.17 of the participant's qualified education loans, whichever is less; 2.18 (3) a selected qualified aircraft technician residing in Minnesota of \$3,000 or the balance 2.19 of the participant's qualified education loans, whichever is less; and 2.20 (4) a selected qualified aircraft technician who is not residing in Minnesota of \$1,500 2.21 or the balance of the participant's qualified education loans, whichever is less. 2.22 (c) An individual may receive disbursements under this section for a maximum of five 2.23 years. 2.24 (d) The participant must provide the commissioner with verification that the full amount 2.25 of the loan repayment disbursement received by the participant has been applied toward the 2.26 designated qualified education loan. After each disbursement, verification must be received 2.27 by the commissioner and approved before the next repayment disbursement is made. 2.28 (e) If the participant receives a disbursement in the participant's fifth year of eligibility, 2.29 the participant must provide the commissioner with verification that the full amount of the 2.30 participant's final loan repayment disbursement was applied toward the designated qualified 2.31 education loan.
