3.1       Sec. 3. **TRANSFER OF FEDERAL FUNDS; APPROPRIATION.**

3.2           (a) \$2,250,000 on June 30, 2022, is appropriated from the COVID-19 flexible response  
3.3 account created within the state fiscal recovery federal fund in the state treasury to the  
3.4 commissioner of education for the payment of additional aid under sections 1 and 2.

3.5           (b) This funding is in addition to any state aid or other moneys appropriated for this  
3.6 purpose.
