.6	Section 1. [136F.38] SUPPLEMENTAL ACADEMIC INSTRUCTION.
.7	Subdivision 1. Definition. For purposes of this section, "supplemental academic
.8	instruction" means corequisite instruction in reading, writing, or mathematics for students
.9	with academic deficiencies who are placed into college-level coursework.
.10	Subd. 2. Establishment. (a) The board shall establish at each campus a
.11	supplemental academic instruction program.
.12	(b) The program must:
.13	(1) allow a student to enroll in an entry-level credit-bearing college-level course in
.14	reading, writing, or mathematics while receiving supplemental academic instruction on
.15	the same subject and during the same term as the course in which the student is enrolled;
.16	(2) provide a student with targeted support related to the credit-bearing college-level
.17	course including, but not limited to, tutoring and directed group study time, to increase the
.18	student's understanding of the college-level coursework; and
.19	(3) minimize the use of developmental noncredit courses for students in need
.20	of additional academic support.
.21	Subd. 3. Eligibility. (a) The board shall establish guidelines to determine student
.22	eligibility for supplemental academic instruction using multiple measures of assessment.
.23	The program must be available to students who did not meet the minimum course placement
.24	criteria and who would otherwise be required to enroll in developmental noncredit courses.

3.1	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment.
3.2	The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities must begin
3.3	offering supplemental academic instruction at each Minnesota State College and
3.4	University campus by the beginning of the 2017-2018 academic year.
