1.6	Section 1. [138.935] HISTORIC PRESERVATION CORPS.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Definition. For the purposes of this section "historic preservation corps"
1.8	means a nonprofit corporation under section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code that
1.9	provides on-the-job training and workforce development skills to youth and young adults
1.10	by engaging them in the repair and maintenance of historic structures, buildings, and sites.
1.11	Subd. 2. Joint powers. Historic preservation corps are governmental units for the
1.12	purposes of section 471.59 and have the rights and liabilities available under that section.
1.13	Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 471.59, subdivision 1, is amended to read:
1.14	Subdivision 1. Agreement. Two or more governmental units, by agreement entered into
1.15	through action of their governing bodies, may jointly or cooperatively exercise any power
1.16	common to the contracting parties or any similar powers, including those which are the
1.17	same except for the territorial limits within which they may be exercised. The agreement
1.18	may provide for the exercise of such powers by one or more of the participating governmental
1.19	units on behalf of the other participating units. The term "governmental unit" as used in this
1.20	section includes every city, county, town, school district, independent nonprofit firefighting
1.21	corporation, other political subdivision of this or another state, another state, federally
1.22	recognized Indian tribe, the University of Minnesota, the Minnesota Historical Society,
