1.6	Section 1. [299A.86] REWARD ACCOUNT FOR INFORMATION ON MISSING
1.7	AND MURDERED INDIGENOUS RELATIVES.
1.8	Subdivision 1. Account created. An account for rewards for information on missing
1.9	and murdered Indigenous relatives is created in the special revenue fund. Money deposited
1.10	into the account is appropriated to the commissioner of public safety to pay rewards and
1.11	for other purposes as authorized under this section.
1.12	Subd. 2. Reward. The director of the Office for Missing and Murdered Indigenous
1.13	Relatives, in consultation with the reward advisory group established under subdivision 3:
1.14	(1) shall determine the eligibility criteria and procedures for granting rewards under this
1.15	section; and
1.16	(2) is authorized to pay a reward to any person who provides relevant information relating
1.17	to a missing and murdered Indigenous relative investigation.
1.18	Subd. 3. Reward advisory group. (a) The director of the Office for Missing and
1.19	Murdered Indigenous Relatives, in consultation with the stakeholder groups described in
1.20	section 299A.85, subdivision 5, shall appoint an advisory group to make recommendations
