1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2023 Supplement, section 120B.021, subdivision 1, is
1.7	amended to read:
1.8	Subdivision 1. Required academic standards. (a) The following subject areas are
1.9	required for statewide accountability:
1.10	(1) language arts;
1.11	(2) mathematics, encompassing algebra II, integrated mathematics III, or an equivalent
1.12	in high school, and to be prepared for the three credits of mathematics in grades 9 through
1.13	12, the grade 8 standards include completion of algebra;
1.14	(3) science, including earth and space science, life science, and the physical sciences,
1.15	including chemistry and physics;
1.16	(4) social studies, including history, geography, economics, and government and
1.17	citizenship that includes civics;
1.18	(5) physical education;
1.19	(6) health, for which locally developed academic standards apply; and
1.20	(7) the arts. Public elementary and middle schools must offer at least three and require
1.21	at least two of the following five arts areas: dance; media arts; music; theater; and visual

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arts. Public high schools must offer at least three and require at least one of the following
five arts areas: media arts; dance; music; theater; and visual arts.

(b) For purposes of applicable federal law, the academic standards for language arts,
mathematics, and science apply to all public school students, except the very few students
with extreme cognitive or physical impairments for whom an individualized education
program team has determined that the required academic standards are inappropriate. An
individualized education program team that makes this determination must establish
alternative standards.

(c) The department may modify SHAPE America (Society of Health and Physical
Educators) standards and adapt the national standards to accommodate state interest. The
modification and adaptations must maintain the purpose and integrity of the national
standards. The department must make available sample assessments, which school districts
may use as an alternative to local assessments, to assess students' mastery of the physical
education standards beginning in the 2018-2019 school year.

(d) A school district may must include child physical and sexual abuse prevention 2.15 instruction in a health curriculum, consistent with paragraph (a), clause (6). Child physical 2.16 and sexual abuse prevention instruction may must include age-appropriate multisession, 2.17 multimodal, culturally inclusive, developmentally appropriate, and culturally sensitive 2.18 instruction on identifying emotional and physical child abuse and other forms of personal 2.19 violence, recognizing sexual abuse and assault, boundary violations, and ways offenders 2.20 groom or desensitize victims, as well as strategies to promote disclosure, reduce self-blame, 2.21 and mobilize bystanders. A school district may provide instruction under this paragraph in 2.22 a variety of ways, including at an annual assembly or classroom presentation. A school 2.23 district may also provide parents information on the warning signs of child physical and 2.24 sexual abuse, the medical and emotional effects of child abuse, and available resources. A 2.25 school district must train instructors on managing disclosures that may result during the 2.26 delivery of child physical and sexual abuse prevention instruction and develop a policy on 2.27 how to respond to the disclosures. 2.28

(e) District efforts to develop, implement, or improve instruction or curriculum as a
result of the provisions of this section must be consistent with sections 120B.10, 120B.11,
and 120B.20.
