1.9	(b) A host county or counties must fund:
1.10	(1) planning, design, engineering, construction, prerevenue operations, and other costs
1.11	associated with guideway development that exceed federal, state, local government, or other
1.12	funds dedicated to the guideway. This requirement pertains to all costs associated with
1.13	guideway development, including associated costs not eligible for federal funding;
1.14	(2) operating costs of guideway services determined by the service operator to be
1.15	necessary to meet reasonable standards for access, safety, and reliability and that exceed
1.16	fare revenues and federal, state, local government, or other funds dedicated to the guideway;

1.18	(3) capital maintenance, replacement, and modernization costs determined by the operator
1.19	of guideway services to be necessary to meet reasonable standards for access, safety,
1.20	reliability, and upkeep of the guideway and that exceed federal, state, local government, or
