1.5	Section 1. REINVEST IN FISH HATCHERIES CITIZEN-LEGISLATIVE
1.6	ADVISORY GROUP.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Advisory group established; duties. (a) A 12-member Reinvest in Fish
1.8	Hatcheries Citizen-Legislative Advisory Group is created to study the status of Minnesota's
1.9	fish hatchery system, the commissioner of natural resources' programs on stocking walleye
1.10	and other fish, and natural fish reproduction.
1.11	(b) The advisory group must study the public priorities and life cycle of Minnesota's
1.12	fish hatchery system and a cost-benefit analysis, consider issues of accountability and
1.13	transparency, and examine reviews and analyses of:
1.14	(1) the economics of Minnesota's fish- and angling-related activities and the tax revenue
1.15	to the state's general fund;
1.16	(2) any Department of Natural Resources surveys and polling of Minnesota angler
1.17	priorities;

3.6	finance no later than January 15, 2021, describing its work and recommendations. The
3.7	advisory group is encouraged to identify and include in the report any statutory changes,
3.8	funding requests, and bonding requests needed to implement the advisory group's
3.9	recommendations.
3.10	Subd. 6. Expiration. This section expires June 30, 2021.

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
